### FIRE PIT\$

Fire pits on private property must not be larger than 21.5 cubic feet and are required to be covered with a heavy gauge metal screen. Only cut, seasoned wood or charcoal can be burned in fire pits; all other materials are prohibited. For more information, refer to the Town's Open-Air Fire Bylaw No. 16/94.

### LEASH YOUR PET!

A friendly reminder to all pet owners in Wadena that Town bylaw requires pets to be leashed. Even if you think your dog is obedient enough to walk off leash, keeping your dog on a leash keeps your dog safe and keeps other dogs and animals safe. A number of complaints have been logged in regard to dog owners exercising their dogs off leash on Main Street and other areas of town. The Town has an designated off-leash area at McClymont Lions Sportsgrounds to the east of the entrance road.

### RESIDENTIAL FENCES

A permit is not required; however, fence construction and placement must be in compliance with the Town's bylaw. Fence heights are limited to 2 m (6.6 ft) in side and rear yards and fences are not permitted in front yards. To assist with proper fence placement, the Town offers a property pin locate service for \$50 per lot.

### VISIBLE HOUSE NUMBERS

House numbers should be BIG and BOLD. When responding to an emergency, RCMP, EMS and firefighters look for house numbers. Remember, these numbers could be a lifesaver in the case of emergency, so make sure they are easily seen.

# TREE BRANCH PICK UP

**Thursday, Aug 20 (West) Friday, Aug 21 (East)**

- Branches must be placed next to the front curb by 7:00am on pick up day. Staff will not come back for branches put out later in the day.
- Branches cannot exceed 4 feet in length and 3 inches in diameter.
- Branches will be picked up free-of charge only when the amount is no larger than one half-ton size load. Loads larger than one half-ton size will be subject to a pickup fee of \$50.00 per load.



⇒ This service **DOES NOT** include pickup of household items, junk or compost.

⇒ **DO NOT** prune elm trees from April 1 to August 31.

# Compost Collection

## Leaf and Yard Waste

### ✓ What goes in:

- Cornstalks and garden plants
- Grass and leaves
- Small tree trimmings and shrubs
- Tree branches no longer than 4 feet and maximum 3 inch diameter.

### ⊘ What stays out:

- Animal Feces
- Dirt, sod, soil
- Flower pots and plastic
- Kitchen organic waste
- Root balls, tree trunks, stumps and large branches.

### ✓ Contain it:

- Compost in clear bags (max 40 lb)
- Branches stacked neatly and tied

## May 4 – November 3

Mondays: *West of Main & South of Highway 5*

Tuesdays: *East of Main St N*

All compost will be picked up from the **FRONT** street and should be placed by 7am. Compost collection contractor can be reached at 306-320-1974.
